Pre-Camp Preparation

*Please make sure all items are marked with the camper's name for easy identification. Remember that Chewacla State Park is a popular place and will not be responsible for lost or stolen items.

• What to wear: Day Camp shirt, closed toe shoes, any other weather appropriate clothing. This applies to adults and youth. FOOTWEAR POLICY (RULES): All campers, Scouts, staff, parents, and visitors are always required to wear closed toe shoes while attending day camp.

Make sure you and your youth wear clothes/shoes that can get dirty or stained. It would be advisable to bring an extra change of clothes/shoes for after all activities are complete. This will be a fun, colorful, and messy weekend.

• What to bring: Camping chairs, picnic blankets, reusable water bottles, lunch, bug spray, Scout Handbook, money for trading post, and day pack.

• **Heath Forms:** The BSA Annual Health form parts A & B <u>Download here</u> are required to attend. This includes all campers, adults and staff. The Health Officer must keep the Medical Forms with them. (Fish on! Requires an Activity Consent Form)

Do NOT bring: Pets, pocketknives, matches/fire starters of any kind.

Check-In Procedures

Check-in on Friday, November 8th will begin at 4:45 at the CCC (Group Camp Area) On Saturday and Monday check-in will begin at 8:45 at the Lower Pavilion.

Sunday check-in will begin at 12:45 at the Lower Pavilion.

Campers will then be assigned to Dens. Dens will have Scouts from other Packs in the Chattahoochee Council along with many non-Scouting friends. We encourage you to invite friends and will do our best to place "friends" in the same den.

We want you to be involved in your camper's life and participate!

Don't just drop them off. We are a fun group of people, hang around and see.

Identification

Wearing your day camp shirt is important. Each youth and adult at camp will be required to wear the provided T-shirt for the duration of camp. The shirts will be provided during Friday night check-in. Additional T-Shirts are available to purchase during the registration process for \$15.00 each.

Check-out Procedures

At the end of the day everyone will gather at the flags for announcements and the closing ceremony. After the closing ceremony the Day Camp Staff will ensure every scout leaves with the proper parent/guardian.

Trading Post

A trading post can help a camper learn to manage their money. It will be cash only. Trading post open/closed times will be announced at check-in. Five dollars a day should be plenty. The trading post will mostly carry snack items at this event. We will do our best to carry a variety of items to meet any allergy or dietary restrictions.

Safety

Lost/Missing Camper-

- 1. If, at any time, a youth participant is believed to be missing, the adult participant or Den leader, MUST notify Day Camp Leadership with all known information.
- 2. The front gate at Chewacla State Park will be notified immediately.
- 3. Camp Staff will confirm last known locations and search all program areas.
- 4. If a missing person is not found, then search continues to all restrooms, vehicles and Chewacla property.
- 5. If a missing person has not been located, authorities will be contacted by the Camp Director.
- 6. The Camp Director will notify the child's parents.
- 7. Hazardous Weather- If hazardous weather occurs during camp we will seek shelter in the restrooms. See map on last page.
