Location: Camp Pine Mountain – 565 Old West Point Rd, West Pine, GA 31833

Date: September 21, 2024

Participants: The Day event is open to all Cub Leaders, Cub Scouts and their families, including siblings.

Registration Fee - \$30 per Scout and/or sibling. (includes hotdog combo)

Early Bird Registration Fee: Register Early at \$25 per participating Scout or sibling – Early Bird Pricing ends September 1, 2024, at Midnight. **Extended through September 6th at Midnight!**

Registration Dates: August 1, 2024 – September 15, 2024. NO ONSITE REGISTRSTION

Cancellation Policy: A full refund will be honored if requested on or before 9/01/2024. A 50% Refund will be honored if requested on or before 09/14/2024. NO refunds will be honored on or after 9/15/2024

Food: Hot dog, chips, and drink included in the registration fee for each paid Scout/Sibling. Parents/guardians can purchase additional hotdog combos for \$6.00.

Parking: All vehicles must be parked in the designated parking lot area only. At all Family Events, vehicles will NOT be authorized to drive in or to campsites.

Clean-up Activities: 3:45 – 4:15 – A Scout is clean – leave no trace. Please encourage Scouts to pick up trash, etc. around camp

Equipment Needed: Camping chairs, picnic blankets, reusable water bottles – Water stations will be set up throughout the camp.

Clothing/Shoes

- Please wear a Class B T-shirt for day activities and have your Field Uniform (also known as Class A) available for the Scouts Own Service.
- (RULES): All campers, Scouts, staff, parents, and visitors are required to wear **closed toe shoes** while on camp property. No sandals.

Certificate: Each Scout should strive to participate in all activities (get a stamp on their card) and will receive a certificate as part of their registration fee.

Guidelines and Procedures:

General information:

- We will follow all guidelines and procedures recommended by the CDC, the State of Georgia, the Chattahoochee Council, and all municipalities within our council.
- All Scouts, parents, and leaders will be expected to follow the procedures and guidelines outlined to ensure a safe and successful experience for all involved.
- Please be respectful of all volunteers & follow their directions.
- Make sure all parents and leaders know not to park in front of or beside the Program House.
- There will be NO onsite registration. PRE-Registration is required.
- Each Scout will have a round robin schedule to limit the number of participants in each area; you must follow your schedule.
 - Lions/Kindergarten and Tigers/ 1st Grade Parents MUST attend each rotation with their Child. Schedule's will be assigned by Rank.
 - All parents and guardians are encouraged to participate and assist with activities.

Check in Procedures:

All participating youth will receive a wristband at check-in. The check-in location will be at the front of the bathhouse from 8:15 - 8:45 AM on the day of activities. Wristbands **MUST ALWAYS BE WORN!** The color of the wrist band will coordinate with what event rotation your Scout is on.

First Aid:

There will be a designated first aid kit located at the bath house for emergency purposes and a health officer onsite.

Camp Activity Volunteers:

We need volunteers to help run the fun activity stations. This is a great opportunity for Troops to earn service hours. As you all know it takes a great number of volunteers to run activities and we cannot do it without you! Please consider helping with fun activity stations, afternoon clean up and parking as well.
